THIS IS AN IMPORTANT EMERGENCY MESSAGE FOR PERSONS LOCATED IN THE FOLLOWING AREAS OF LASALLE COUNTY:

1	Brookfield Township	Encompasses all of Brookfield Township , boundaries are defined as: • North by the Illinois River • East by E 30th Road (also the Grundy County Line) • South by N 18th Road • West by E. 24th Road
10	Manlius Township and Miller Township	Encompasses all of Manlius Township and the south most half mile of Miller Township , boundaries are defined as: • North by I-80 • East by E 30th Road (also the Grundy County Line) • South by the Illinois River • West by E 24th Road •
11	Rutland Township	Encompasses the south third of Rutland Township , boundaries are defined as: • North by I-80 • East by E 24th Road • South by the Illinois River • West – On the south half mile of the West Boundary by E 18th - On the north two miles of the West Boundary by the Fox River
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An incident has been reported at the LaSalle County Nuclear Power Station.

Based upon current plant conditions and recommendations from state and federal authorities, protective action decisions have been implemented.

All people within the identified areas are directed to SHELTER IN PLACE IMMEDIATELY.

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DO NOT EVACUATE AT THIS TIME.

I repeat, DO NOT EVACUATE.

Evacuating now may increase your risk of exposure to radioactive materials.

If you are outdoors, proceed immediately to the nearest building. Enter your home, workplace, or another substantial structure without delay.

Once inside:

- Close and secure all doors and windows
- Turn off heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems that draw in outside air
- Move to a basement or interior room away from doors and windows
- Remain indoors until additional instructions are issued

Schools, hospitals, and nursing care facilities within the affected area are implementing approved emergency procedures under trained supervision. Do not attempt to travel to these facilities.

Telephone use should be limited to emergency calls only. Use text messaging for communicating to keep telephone lines available for emergency response operations.

Individuals located in parks, recreational areas, or traveling within the affected area who cannot immediately access shelter should leave the affected area and seek indoor shelter outside the designated zone.

Agricultural operators should discontinue outdoor activities and take shelter immediately.

People outside the shelter-in-place area should not enter the affected area until authorities announce that conditions are safe.

While remaining indoors, you may prepare for a possible evacuation if later directed. Gather essential medications, clothing, important documents, and necessary supplies for up to three days. Do not go outdoors to obtain these items.

Monitor NOAA Weather Radio or tune your radio to WCMY 1430 AM or 93.5 FM or WRKX 95.3 FM for official updates and additional instructions from LaSalle County emergency officials.

Repeat — residents within the identified areas are to SHELTER IN PLACE immediately and DO NOT evacuate unless instructed to do so by emergency officials.
